On February 8, 2012, Ingo Maurer presents the animated feature-length film *Chico and Rita*, directed by Fernando Trueba and Javier Mariscal. Chico is a young Cuban piano player with big dreams, Rita a beautiful singer with an extraordinary voice. Music and romantic desire unite them, but their journey - in the tradition of the Latin ballad, the bolero, brings heartache and torment. The story is set against backdrops of Havana, New York, Las Vegas and Paris.

Javier Mariscal lives and works in Barcelona. His work spans a wide range of mediums, from graphic art, sculpture to interior design and landscaping. He created the corporate design for the Barcelona Olympics in 1992 and the corporate identity for Expo 2000 in Hannover, Germany. Ingo Maurer will give a short speech to introduce the movie and his personal relation to Javier Mariscal.

"I have seen *Chico and Rita* at the opening of the Design Museum Holon, Israel. It is a great movie, just as powerful and lively as Mariscal is.", says Ingo Maurer.
